According to a report from First 5 California, 56 percent of incoming kindergartners in Alameda County arrive in the classroom without basic academic and social skills such as being able to express themselves, being able to listen, getting along with others and coping with adversity.

Habitot exists in the face of those stark reports, as a place where all children have a chance to gain these critical developmental skills.

Over its 21 year history, Habitot has become a vital resource for many families and service agencies in Alameda County.

Classes and clinics, a Family Resource Center, our year-round Early Child Safety Campaign, and a Toy Lending Library. At Habitot, parents have opportunities to strengthen their connection with their children, meet other parents, and acquire the tools needed to help their children learn.

Habitot includes over 8,000 families facing challenges through free admission and memberships, scholarships, and special programs that remove financial barriers so all families can visit. No one is turned away at Habitot!


